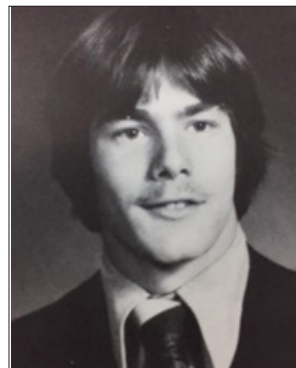
The 1967 Penn Yan Mustangs

The 7th class will be inducted into the Penn Yan Academy Athletic Hall of Fame Sept. 22. The PYA Athletic Hall of Fame Class of 2017 features the championship Penn Yan Mustang football of 1967, Paul Chapman (PYA Class of 1979), Raymond "Butch" Mashewske (PYA Class of 1983), Jennifer Miles McKie (PYA Class of 1995), and Michael Manley (PYA Class of 2007).

1967 Mustang Football team

Talking with members of this squad, they to a man, emphasize the word "team." By definition, a team is a group working to achieve a common goal or a common end. The Mustang gridiron team entered the 1967 football season with little fanfare from the media, their opponents, or even the community. They were a young team with a lot of talent, but probably another season away from contending for a league title. But they set out in the hot '67 summer double sessions on a mission. They were going to be the best football team they could and prove the experts were wrong. The Mustang coaching staff of Jack Marshall and Dave Currier believed in them. More importantly, they believed in themselves. The roster

was loaded with a lot of athletic ability and speed. They just had to figure out the formula to convert these assets into a competitive team. And that they did.

The Mustangs started the 1967 season with a new defense, some early injuries, and some question marks. Penn Yan, for over a decade, used a 7 diamond defense. But they would operate out of a 5-2 defense this year. They quickly proved they had the athletes to do this and adapted to the new look defense. They shutdown and baffled a potent and talented Batavia team in their preseason scrimmage. They opened the regular season with a huge 33-0 win over Haverling. In week two they defeated a very good Clyde-Savannah team 32-26 at home and rolled over DeSales 59-6 in week number three. People were starting to take notice of this upstart Mustang team.

Their biggest game of the year was in week four. They took on powerful Mt. Carmel from Auburn, a team that

hadn't lost in over two seasons and the favorite to win the Wayne/Finger Lakes Championship. The two teams battled to a 6-6 tie midway through the final quarter. Mt. Carmel kicked a field goal and pulled away to a 16-6 victory. But the tough loss was not going to derail the Mustang mission.

The Orange and Blue rebounded with a 47-13 romp over Waterloo, followed by a 62-0 victory over Lyons.

When Mt. Carmel was upset by Geneva, three teams, including Penn Yan, had a chance to win the conference.

Penn Yan traveled to Seneca Falls to take on a very tough Blue Devils in the next to last week. After struggling and trailing in the first half, Penn Yan rallied to defeat Mynderse 28-13 to set up the final week and a chance to win the title.

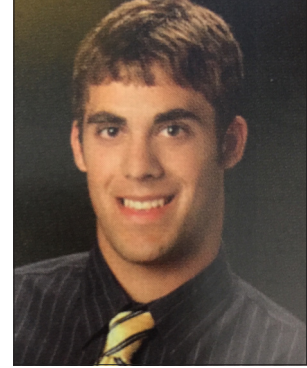
The last contest of the season was the traditional Johnson-Costello American Legion Veteran's Day Trophy game against Geneva. The Panthers came into this

game with just one loss and a huge upset over Mt. Carmel. The winner of this game would clinch at least a share of the W/FL title. Before a huge, cheering home crowd, the Mustangs shutout the Geneva Panthers 20-0. The American Legion trophy was theirs, and so was a hard fought share of the Wayne/Finger Lakes title. The season which started in the hot sun of August successfully ended on the cold, Mustang gridiron in November. The 1967 football Mustangs were champs.

The 1967 Penn Yan Mustang football team scored a league high 287 points that season, 36 points per game. The stingy Penn Yan defense dominated, limiting the opposition to just 74 points, including 3 shutouts. Sixteen different Penn Yan players scored touchdowns. Twenty-eight of the 33 players on the roster earned varsity letters. Of course, legendary Penn Yan Coach Jack Marshall was named "Coach of the Year."

The 1967 Mustang football team could be called "over achievers." But that would not be accurate. They worked hard to be the best they could be and that best proved to be of championship caliber. They believed in themselves as a team. In the critical game against Mynderse, which they did not play well in the first half and trailed for most of the first half, Coach Jack Marshall addressed his team on the bus at half-time.

Penn Yan Quarterback Brian Legg remembered Coach Marshall's tone was not particularly pleasant. "I thought the windows of the bus were going to blow out," recalled Legg. But the inspiring speech ignited a second half Mustang surge which propelled them to the key 28-13. They loved and respected their coach and didn't want to let him down. But they also believed in themselves and their abilities. That's what championship teams do.

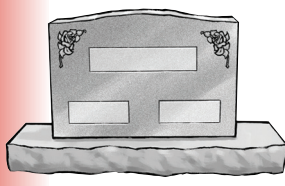

This is a wonderful 50-year celebration for this team. The members of this championship team are: Jim Blank, Bob Breuer, John Brezinsky, Tom Butcher, Rod Campo, Bruce Castner (Captain), Pat Chapman, Lee Collins, Morris Collins, Amby Cook, Don D'Amico, Tom Edminster, Gary Fox, Rick Gray, Brian Hawley, Fred Johnson, Brian Legg, Jim Mahan, Tom Morse (Captain), Nate Olney, Bob Parmalee, Parker Reynolds, Steve Richmond, Calvin Sans, Don Shipman, Skip Soper, Phil Viele, Bill Whitaker, and Dick Willson. Carroll Graves, Rick Pallatto, and Jens Jensen were team managers. Walter Ballard and Mike Gillard were the team trainers. Jack Marshall and David Currier coached the varsity team. Jerry Turner and Russell Soper coached the J.V. team.

Paul Chapman

Paul Chapman, a 1979 PYA graduate, was a 3-sport standout during his years at PYA. He earned seven varsity letters from 1977 through 1979. Paul was a running back and defensive back for the gridiron Mustangs in 1977 - 78. Chapman was a gifted running back, averaging over 6 yards per carry. As a receiver, Paul averaged 29 yards per catch. He scored 8 touchdowns for the Mustangs. Chapman was named to the Wayne/Finger Lakes First Team Offensive and Defensive teams during those years. Paul was also named to the All New York State Third Offensive Team as a halfback.

On the basketball court, Chapman was a gifted guard for the Orange and Blue cagers. He was a tremendous shooter who could score from any point on the court. But his ability to find open teammates with pinpoint passes was possibly his greatest team asset. Paul was a dominant presence of the basketball court. He was

a true team leader.

Paul Chapman was a very gifted baseball player also. He won the batting title in the Penn Yan Little League as a 10-year-old. But that was only the beginning. Paul was a gifted outfielder and tremendous hitter for the Penn Yan Mustang baseball teams from 1977 until 1979. He holds the school record for hits in a season with 27, and runs scored with 29. Chapman had a .469 batting average and .580 on base percentage for the Mustangs in 1979. Paul Chapman's name dominates the Mustang baseball record book. His diamond success at PYA earned him a number of post season honors including First Team All League and Section V selections.

Paul Chapman continued his football career in college at Brockport State. He was a 4-year starter on the gridiron for the Golden Eagles. Chapman was named a co-captain for two years, and was a valuable part of the success of this winning collegiate football program. After his playing career was over, Paul continued his success and hard work in business. He cherishes his kids and family life. Paul is active in his community and helps out organizing and coaching in the Marcus Whitman area youth sports leagues.

Raymond "Butch" Mashewski

Butch Mashewski earned five Varsity Mustang letters during his playing days at the Academy. He was a standout lineman for the gridiron Mustangs during the 1980, 1981, and 1982 campaigns.

The Orange and Blue 11 won three consecutive Section V titles during those years. Mashewski was a true team leader and co-captain, anchoring both the offensive and defensive lines. He was named to the All-Greater Rochester team in 1982, and was also a First Team All New York State selection.

Butch was also a 3-year All Finger Lakes All star selection.

On the baseball diamond, Butch Mashewski was a true team leader. He was a member of the Diamond Mustangs during the 1982 and 1983 seasons. The 1983 team won the school's first and only Section V title. This title team was elected to the school's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2016. As the catcher, Butch Mashewski was the "Field General" of this team. He was an exceptional defensive catcher who worked well with the team pitchers. Mashewski was a talented hitter with potent home-run power. His presence on the diamond helped mold these Penn Yan teams into winners.

After high school, Butch continued his football career in college at Hudson Valley College and Edinboro. He has been very active in the community youth sports programs coaching and serving on the Boards of the Youth Football and Baseball organizations.

Jennifer Miles (McKie)

Jennifer Miles was an outstanding, 4-sport athlete representing Penn Yan Academy from 1992-1995. Her work ethic and ability to lead was a major attribute and helped drive her athletic career. Jennifer was recognized as a leader by both her coaches and teammates. Her post season honors included two GAA Varsity Club Awards, the Norah Michelle Bartlett Award, and the Girl's Coach's Trophy in 1995.

Jennifer Miles excelled on the Penn Yan Girl's track team as a freshman, sophomore, and junior. She set a school records in the 100m and 400m hurdle events. Her 15.6 time in the 100m and 67.5 in 400m are school marks that still stand. Terry Test, long-time PYA track coach stated, "Jennifer led by setting a great example of work ethic at practice and a true competitor during meets."

Jennifer Miles was most dominant on the basketball court. She

was a two-time captain of Mustang girl's team. The Orange and Blue advanced to the Section V tournament every year. She scored 922 career points, pulled down 413 rebounds, had 139 steals, and dished out 342 assists during her outstanding career at PYA. Jennifer was a two-time All Finger Lakes League selection, was named to the All-Greater Rochester All-star team, and was named the Most Valuable Player in the 1995 Section V Tournament. She rounded out her high school basketball career by playing in the Ronald McDonald Game in 1995.

Jennifer was also a standout soccer player and fierce competitor during the autumn. In her senior year, she played for the Penn Yan Mustang girl's lacrosse team helping them win a Finger Lakes League title in 1995.

Jennifer earned a full scholarship to play basketball for Daemen College in Buffalo. Unfortunately, a major knee injury cut short her collegiate career. She earned her degree in physical therapy. She is a physical therapist and happily lives in Oregon with her husband. Jennifer continues to help and lead in the field of sports, not by playing. She now helps youth athletes to overcome injury and learn to push themselves to succeed.

Michael Manley

Penn Yan Academy has a long tradition of producing some very gifted athletes in a wide variety of sports. But it would be hard to find a former Mustang athlete who has excelled in a sport like Michael Manley has in the sport of lacrosse. Manley was also an outstanding member of the Orange and Blue football team. But his résumé in lacrosse would be difficult to match. His athletic accomplishments and numbers certainly speak for themselves. But his dedication to hard work and unbelievable ability to lead by example makes his addition to PYA Athletic Hall of

Fame a no-brainer.

He is one of the finest athletes ever to play for the Penn Yan Mustangs.

Michael Manley played football and lacrosse for PYA from 2003 until 2007. He earned eight varsity letters, and was also an excellent student and scholar. His hard work on the athletic field and also in the classroom earned him a full scholarship to Duke University.

On the gridiron, Michael was a fantastic defensive player. At linebacker, he was dominant. In his senior year, Manley recorded 84 solo tackles, 47 assisted tackles, 3 blocked kicks, 2 interceptions, and recovered 4 fumbles. On defense, he converted 2 fumbles into touchdowns. Manley was also a team leader on offense as a tight end. He was a team captain and a leader on both offense and defense. Manley was named to the First Team All Finger Lakes team for three straight seasons from 2004 until 2006. In 2006, he was named to the First Team All-Greater Rochester and also the All New York State Team as a linebacker. Michael also was named the Ontario Honda Defensive Player of the Year in 2006. He ended his high school football career by playing in the "Eddie Meath" all-star game. Impressive football numbers for sure, but it would be the sport of lacrosse that would produce the most striking successful numbers. Statistics and honors that would be parleyed into an impressive collegiate career and a trip to the pros.

Michael Manley was a star defenseman for the Mustang laxers from 2003 until 2007. Those teams won 5 Section V titles and advanced to the New York State Tournament every one of those seasons. He was named to the First Team All Finger Lakes team four times and also the Section V Class C All Tournament team in 2006 and 2007. As Mustang team captain, Manley was named the Rochester Democrat and Chronicle Lacrosse Play-

er of the Year in 2007. U.S. Lacrosse named him a High School All-American, their highest honor. Michael Manley is the all-time scorer for defensemen at PYA with 21 career goals and 25 career assists. Inside Lacrosse ranked Manley as the No. 8 recruit in the Nation in 2007 and he was named an Under Armour All-American, the highest honor a high school lacrosse player can be given. And a little high school icing on the cake, Michael Manley played in the Empire State Games three times. An amazing high school lacrosse career.

After high school, Manley was a Duke Blue Devil from 2008 until 2012. He started every game on defense for the Blue Devils during those years including the NCAA National Championship team of 2010. Michael was named Atlantic Coast Conference Rookie of the Year in 2008, and was a team captain from 2010 to 2012. Manley was named to the NCAA All-tournament team in 2010 and was an NCAA All-American in 2010, 2011, and 2012..


After college, Michael Manley moved on to professional lacrosse. He was the 3rd overall pick in the MLL draft, signing with the Rochester Rattlers in 2012. He was named the MLL Defenseman of the Year in 2014 and 2016, and was named an MLL All Star four times. During the winter months, Michael Manley plays professional indoor lacrosse in the National Lacrosse League. He has played for the Philadelphia Wild, New England Black Wolves, and recently signed to play for the Rochester Knights-hawks. Coach Brian Hobart summed up Michael Manley's Hall of Fame credentials. "Michael Manley to me exemplifies what a Penn Yan athlete should be. His toughness, drive, commitment, and pride in his community make up every aspect that is desirable in the student athletes who come through Penn Yan Academy. Michael is a true Hall of Famer."
