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hen looking for an appliance store, you want one with a large selection of American made namebrand products and repair service. Most of today's major home appliances are more complex than ever before, contain mini-computers and don't last as long as they used to. They have great features that may need repair.

Do your research. How do you know what to look for in a quality appliance store? Product and business online review sites are great references. However, remember that some people are hard to please and they are more likely to leave comments than are those who are happy with the products they received.

Two of the best sites to check are Consumer Reports (www.consumerreports.org) and the Better business Bureau (www.BBB.org). Both offer reviews of stores and products. To be listed on the Better Business Bureau site, stores must have

a long history of reliable, reputable customer satisfaction. Some stores have pages on their websites for customer comments and reviews.

Local newspapers ads and their websites are another source to find reputable dealers.

Be cautious when purchasing appliances over the Internet. Read the fine print. Be aware that online purchases do not generally include most customer service features you will need and want; such as, free delivery, installation, old appliance removal, operating instructions, warranty protection, return policies, financing and repair services. If an appliance comes damaged, does not fit or perform properly you may have little recourse.

Compare dealers by using a checklist: delivery window, delivery and installation charges, warranty options, repair services, rebates and final price.

Washers and driers typically go on sale in the winter, refrigerators in the spring and other kitchen appliances (ranges, cook tops, microwaves, wall ovens, vent hoods, dishwashers, etc.) in the fall.

Before you shop, measure your opening where the new appliances will be installed. Write them down and take them with you to the dealers. While some appliances are a standard size, many are not. You do not want to have the appliance delivered only to find out that it is too large for your cabinet opening or space. Allow for doors that may open in the way of the appliance as well.

When remodeling, it is wise to select your new appliances first and design the cabinetry around them. If you design the cabinets first you may be disappointed later to find that the appliances you want will not fit into the openings already set in the cabinets.

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HOW TO CHOOSE... An Audiologist

Audiologists are highly trained healthcare professionals. In fact, they are the only professionals who are university trained and licensed to specifically identify, evaluate, diagnose, and treat hearing disorders.

Audiologists use specialized equipment and procedures to accurately test for hearing loss. These tests are typically conducted in sound treated rooms with calibrated equipment. The audiologist is trained to inspect the eardrum with an otoscope, perform cerumen (ear wax) removal, conduct diagnostic audiologic tests, and check for medically-related hearing problems. By virtue of their education, training, and licensing, they are the most qualified professionals to assess and treat hearing disorders.

Not all hearing healthcare needs are related to hearing aids. In addition to hearing disorders, audiologists are able to assess and treat balance system dysfunctions, and are trained to perform detailed evaluations of balance and equilibrium. Many are also trained in the treatment of tinnitus (ringing in the ears) and hyperacusis (aversion to loud sounds). Audiologists are also experts in hearing loss prevention, and are able to provide counseling and resources to help prevent noise-induced hearing loss and to monitor hearing and balance disorders that may result from the administration of ototoxic medications, such as chemotherapy.

How does one go about making sure they will be seeing a good audiologist? When it comes to your hearing health, choosing an audiologist is the most important decision you will make. Selecting an audiologist who is licensed, well trained, highly educated, and communicates well is vital to your successful treatment. Look for an audiologist that displays the Doctor of Audiology (Au.D.) diploma. Look for a license, not a certificate.

Remember, a hearing test is a medical fact finding mission. A diagnostic evaluation has many purposes and goals, some of which have nothing to do with a hearing aid. Not every patient needs a hearing aid. Many need a hearing aid and other care. Some need no hearing aid at all after medical management. Call and interview the practice. Make sure they provide additional patient benefits including: highly personalized care, convenient clinic locations, flexible office hours, diverse selection of hearing aids and state of the art treatment options.

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HOW TO CHOOSE THE RIGHT BANK

Some banks might offer overdraft coverage in the form of a high-interest credit line. Other banks charge fees each time an overdraft occurs.

Sometimes, banks provide no coverage. Be sure to research overdraft policies before making a final decision.

These days, it is important to consider a bank's stability. Before you entrust your money to an institution, check its history and financial condition.

Typically, banks invest deposited funds under a fractional reserve banking system. Any bank with a strong balance sheet should be able to weather any turbulence caused by market corrections.

The majority of banks are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation for up to \$250,000 per depositor. This value can vary depending on the type and number of accounts held by a customer.

Provided you understand and act within these safeguards, your money will likely be safe in a bank. That is not to say that failures are impossible. A solid bank will limit exposure to toxic assets that put its balance sheet at risk.


road bikes, but less aerodynamic. It requires effort to pedal, which increases the number of calories burned.

Look for more experienced collectors in your area. You can find them at coin shows and shops. There may even be clubs in your community.

But once you become an expert, don't keep the knowledge to yourself. Give back to the coin collecting community. Help others develop in interest in the hobby as well.





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
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You don't need to be rich to have a financial advisor. These professionals are trained to help you become rich, or at least use your money wisely.

FOOD

Options

When you are searching for a hearing aid, look for special features that will enhance your hearing and your life. Some examples include:


BLUETOOTH CONNECTIONS: You could connect wirelessly to Bluetooth electronic devices, such as smart phones. It allows you to hear phone conversations directly through your hearing aid.

TELEPHONE ADAPTERS: This feature senses when you are talking on the phone and adjusts the setting to make it more clear during your conversation.

DIRECTIONAL MICROPHONE: You can adjust your device to pick up sound that is directly in front of you. For example, when you are having one-on-one conversations with a person, it is useful to turn the microphone to improve your hearing. You may also change the setting to a more general setting that would be useful at public performances or concerts.

REMOTE CONTROL: Some devices allow you to adjust the settings without touching it. A remote control can change the directional microphone or amplification.

After creating a list of candidates, call the Better Business Bureau, your state's board of contractors or the builders' association to check on their reputations. Your town's building inspection office may also have information for you. Avoid companies who have many complaints on their record.

Upon narrowing the list, call the remaining ones and ask about pricing, guarantees and warranties. Also inquire about how long it would take to

complete a job and the manufacturers' brands they use.

If you are purchasing new equipment, find out if you need a separate service contractor or if routine maintenance and repairs are included in the price of installation. Does the company provide around-the-clock emergency service?

High quality HVAC companies are fully licensed, bonded and insured. If a worker is injured or causes damage to your property, that insurance should cover it. Otherwise, you could be liable for the damages. Your insurance premiums would likely increase as a result.

Reputable HVAC companies will usually belong to recognized professional and trade organizations. Some well-known organizations include the North America Technician Excellence (NATE), the Air-Conditioning and Refrigeration Institute, and the American Society of Heating, Refrigeration Air-Conditioning and Engineers. Membership in one of these organizations is not automatic. Applicants are required to have certain certifications. meet professional standards and meet or exceed other requirements before they are admitted.


Before any work begins, verify that all the required building permits are in place. Most companies will file permits on your behalf at the local building codes office. But don't assume that it has happened. Check with the permitting office first. Work done without proper permits could result in a fine and time delay.

Have a load calculation done before installing a new system in any building. The best companies perform a thorough calculation rather than estimate. Buildings change over time due to foundations cracking or settling. It will affect the efficiency of any equipment.

The HVAC company shouldn't use the old unit to determine the proper size of a new one. If your old unit was inadequate, you will want to install a unit that is a different size. Speak with your HVAC installer to determine the right size and model for you.

Ask your HVAC contractor to perform annual checkups to verify that the unit is running at peak efficiency.

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

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

PHILOSOPHY

Qualified doctors don't often share the same philosophy when it comes to medical treatment.

Some surgeons prefer having patients try other options -- such as physical therapy, dietary or lifestyle changes -- before performing surgery. Others think it is wiser to do surgery before a problem gets worse.

At your initial consultation with an orthopedic surgeon, try to understand their medical philosophy. Think about whether it matches your expectations.

The surgeon should make you feel comfortable and confident. A good bedside manner, with excellent knowledge,

experience and communication, will make you feel more relaxed about your health care decisions.

FULL SPECTRUM

The best surgeons help you with preparation and recovery from your medical treatment. They do more than just perform an actual procedure.

They will take the time to answer all your questions patiently and offer practical suggestions to help you hasten your recovery. As well, the doctor will look at your lifestyle to help you become healthier. He will not simply fix your broken or painful body part. Changing your lifestyle and taking better care of yourself may lessen the need for surgery in the future.

HOSPITAL PRIVILEGES

Surgeons must be allowed to operate in facilities. Different hospitals have different levels of technology and equipment. You will want to have the procedure done at a hospital that is equipped to fit your needs.

If you prefer to have the surgery performed at a particular hospital, check to make sure the surgeon is approved to operate at the facility.

If you have sustained injuries in a car accident or other mishap, there's a good chance you will need a personal injury lawyer. A good personal injury attorney can help you recover damages related to the cost of your medical care and other issues. If you ever need a personal injury attorney, it's a good idea to find one in your area sooner rather than later.

HERE ARE A FEW THINGS TO **CONSIDER WHEN PICKING A** PERSONAL INTURY LAWYER:

FIRST STEPS

It is essential that you find a lawyer who is qualified to handle personal injury cases. Find a list of attorneys with the proper credentials and licenses through your local bar association. They will be happy to help you locate professionals in your area. Or you can always search on-line. You can also ask other attorneys who they might recommend for practicing personal injury law. If you have worked with a family law attorney in the past, for instance, that person should be able to suggest a good lawyer who concentrates their practice in personal injury law. Once you have compiled a list, schedule an initial consultation, which is typically free, to talk with the attorney about your case. Tell them about the facts of your case and get their impressions about it. Talk to an attorney, not a paralegal or "investigator." Listen closely to find out about their plans, how they typically resolve cases, and whether you can trust them. Find an attorney who will handle your case on a contingency basis, meaning the lawyer will not be paid unless you receive money, Any qualified lawyer will take your case on a contingent fee. When a lawyer agrees to these terms, it means he has a lot of confidence in your case.

TRACK RECORD

Learn as much as you can about the lawyer's track record in negotiating settlements, including pre-trial settlements and verdicts in trials. Any attorney will undoubtedly tell you about big awards they've won on behalf of clients, but always consider how that relates to your specific situation. Every case is different, so don't assume that big settlements for other clients will translate into the same results for you. It is much more important to find out



how the attorney would handle your case. Have they successfully settled similar cases in the past? How long did the process take? What steps are necessary in the process? How would the lawyer fees and related court costs be handled? You should be satisfied with the answers to these questions before proceeding. By getting as much background information about the attorney as you can, you'll be better armed to make the right decision.

RAPPORT

Finally, you must consider something intangible: the ability to trust, to work closely with your lawyer. Rapport is a vital part of the equation. It's about developing a professional relationship based on mutual respect. You don't have to be buddies with your attorney; you only have to trust them. A good attorney will be available when you need them, and they should talk about complex legal processes in language you can understand. Communication is a big part of the job. When you find all of these qualities, the right background, experience and communication, you'll have a better chance of getting a positive outcome for your case.

RESEARCH

Prior to contacting anyone, educate yourself about common pests in your area. Check to see if these pests are on your property. You might find evidence such as droppings or other indications that they are in your yard or home.

Look on the Internet to discover which solutions are used to control these pests. Some cities or communities have laws regarding pesticide applications. There might be regulations concerning licensing and insurance for pest control companies.

Now, contact the service providers for more detailed information about prices, processes and other information. You should call at least two different businesses so you can compare services.

The company you choose should do a free, full inspection of the property before providing services. Accompany the workers as they check your property - both inside and outside.

Listen to their sales pitch and ask questions. Reliable, reputable business should always answer your questions honestly.

Finally, trust your instincts. If the workers seem inexperienced or you don't trust their information, look elsewhere.

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HOW TO CHOOSE THERAPIST



Most patients visit physical therapists for chronic pain from injuries or if they recently underwent surgery. People with pain in their backs, knees, neck, shoulder or other joints can receive benefits from finding a physical therapist.

Physical therapy helps alleviate pain. It focuses on treating musculoskeletal and neuromusculature disorders. 

Low-emissive, or low-e windows, are the newest improvement to the energy-efficiency mark. Low-e glass traps heat by placing a thin metallic coating on the appropriate windowpane. Indoor heat is reflected back inside; cutting the burden on your home's heating system. Low-e windows complement U and R values. Additionally, LOW-E works for you in the in summertime. Our summer's higher levels of infrared rays are reflected back outside, keeping the interior of the house cooler, and saving work for your home's AC.

UV FACTORS

Blocking UV rays will protect your carpets and furniture from sun damage. That is why a window with high ultra-violent blockage is also recommended.

CASEMENT WINDOWS

Energy efficiency is a major concern for all of us; casement windows are the best choice. Casement windows are hinged on the sides. This design lowers air seepage. When the wind pushes against the glass, the seal becomes tight and reduces leakage. Hinged windows must be maintained, as the seal may erode over time. 





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
